

Tough but Glamorous, Pentas are Summer 'Stars'

Pentas are landscape star that is shining brightly. The reference to stars is very apt, as one common name for this plant is Egyptian Star Cluster. Its shiny, attractive dark green leaves provide great contrast to the bright, beautiful, large clusters of star-shaped flowers. A single plant may produce 15 to 20 flower clusters at one time.



The Butterfly Penta

Butterfly pentas are a taller variety growing up to 24 inches tall and about 18 inches wide.



The Graffiti Penta

Graffiti pentas have a small stature, reaching about 16 inches tall and 12 inches wide.



Blooming Season: Late Spring, Summer, Late Summer

Location: Full sun for at least six hours a day

Characteristics: Flourishes in high heat/humidity and tolerates summer rains well while still showing color. They do require deadheading after blooming, as they are not self-cleaning.

Pollinator Friendly

Pentas attract Bees, Butterflies, and Hummingbirds. They are also Deer and Rabbit resistant!
